

STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY REPORT (2020-21)

CHARUSAT believes that there is a substantial relationship between students' satisfaction and academic excellence. A student satisfaction survey is conducted on regular basis to measure students' satisfaction with their educational experience, establishing a measurable benchmark in areas such as curriculum, facilities, and access to academic resources, as well as the quality and availability of extracurricular activities. The survey includes the NAAC-recommended questionnaire to improve higher education quality. A student must respond to all the questions by selecting the most appropriate of the five responses given in the following format with her/his sincere effort and thought. The questionnaire is divided into two parts: 1) Teacher specific for a particular course, and 2) Institute/Institution specific. Furthermore, a qualitative question is included to provide the student an opportunity for providing suggestions or improvements and mention weaknesses of the institute concerning the teaching-learning process. The questions, as well as the responses given by the students, are as follow:

Various suggestions were given by the students to improve overall teaching-learning quality. Largely the students expressed their gratification in the teaching, learning, and evaluation aspects adopted in the university. However, certain aspects emphasized by the students were: To organize interdepartment events; To enhance more hands-on activities; To emphasize research-oriented activities; To boost opportunities for a student exchange program with other universities, etc.

Thus, in general, the students expressed their satisfaction with an overall satisfaction score of 8.9 on the scale of 10.

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
